In a football organisation there are 672 employees. 259 of these people work in the head office. This means that 413 people do not work at head office.		
In a football tournament there are 32 teams. Each team has 3 goalkeepers. This means there are 106 goalkeepers altogether.		
If a football match lasts for $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours, then half-time is at 80 minutes.		
Tickets for the final match of a football tournament cost £23 for adults and £16.50 for children. This means a family of 2 adults and 3 children would pay £95.50.		
Without counting the goalkeeper, a football team play a formation where $\frac{3}{10}$ of the team are attacking and $\frac{3}{10}$ are midfield. This means that $\frac{2}{5}$ are defending.		
A football match has 360 seconds of extra time. This is the same as 5 minutes of extra time.		
A football pitch is 92m long and 45m wide. This means that the perimeter of the pitch is 274m.

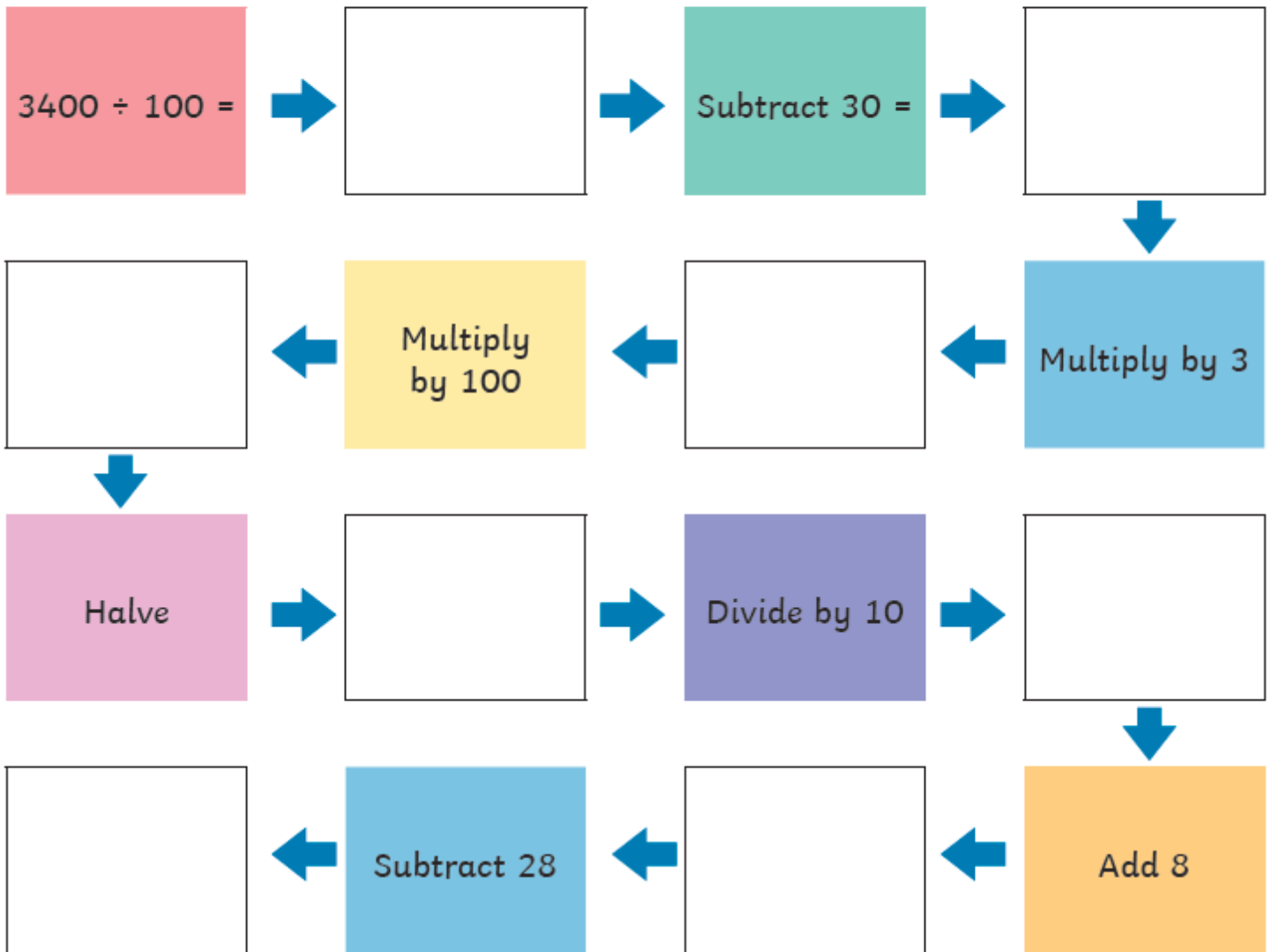

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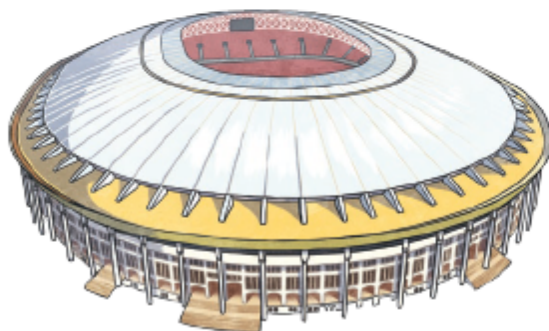
Clue 4: Number Maze

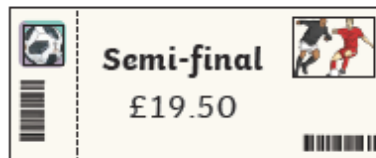
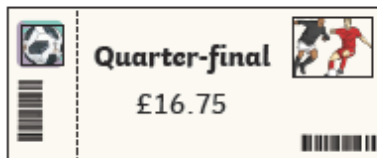
