

## Subtract a three-digit number and ones (mentally)

- 1 Sarah has **120** chocolate buttons. She eats **5**. How many buttons does she have left?

- 2 Humma thought of a number and added **8**. The answer was **128**. What was the number that she first thought of?

- 3 Isiah has collected **172** football cards. This is **6** more than Kyle. How many football cards has Kyle collected?

- 4 Sarah collected **147** badges. She gave **9** of them to her friend. How many badges does Sarah have left?

- 5 Mrs Patel has to drive **248** miles to get home. She drives **9** miles and then stops to buy a newspaper. She then drives another **7** miles and stops to buy petrol. How many more miles does she need to drive to get home?

- 6 There are **143** apples on the trees. The birds eat **9** and **8** more fall off the trees. How many apples are left on the trees?



## Subtract a three-digit number and tens (mentally)

- 1 Kyle has **120** sweets. Humma has **80** sweets. How many more sweets does Kyle have than Humma?

- 2 In the school hall, the site supervisor puts out **122** chairs for the Christmas Nativity Play. By 6 o'clock, people are sitting on **30** chairs. How many chairs are empty?

- 3 Mrs Butler's garden has **138** sunflowers, but **50** die because of the bad weather. How many are left?

- 4 The zookeeper has **212** bananas in a big bag. The monkeys eat **90** bananas for breakfast. How many bananas are left for the monkeys' lunch?

- 5 Humma gets **104** Christmas cards altogether. She gets **70** from girls. How many cards are from boys?

- 6 In a cricket match, Isiah's team score **242** runs.  
Humma's team score **90** runs.  
How many more runs did Isiah's team score than Humma's team?



## Subtract a three-digit number and hundreds (mentally)

- 1 There are **350** pupils at Sunshine Primary School. Classes 3, 4 and 5 go on a trip to the theme park, leaving **200** children at school. How many children went on the trip to the theme park?



- 2 Humma's team score **180** runs in a cricket match. Jessica's team score **100** runs. How many more runs do Humma's team score?

- 3 Sarah is reading a book. The book has **357** pages. She reads **200** pages. How many pages does she have left to read?

- 4 There are **180** bananas and **200** apples for the children at break. **300** pieces of fruit are eaten. How much fruit is left over?

- 5 There are **917** fiction books on the shelves in the library. On Monday, children take away **200** to read and, on Wednesday, children take away **400** to read. How many books are left on the shelves?
