


















Today you are going to:

- Watch a video
- Learn what a mini saga is and how to write one
- Take part in a group discussion
- Generate ideas to write about
- Create a character, setting and plot
- Write a mini saga for Young Writers' Ridiculous Writers mini saga competition



A mini saga is a story told in just 100 words. There are three golden rules of mini saga writing you need to stick to:


- Be original! You can be inspired by other stories, but add a twist, make it your own!
- Keep to the 100-word limit make every word count!
- Remember that mini sagas must have a beginning, a middle and an end, and still make sense!






Your teacher is going to show you two words - one noun and one verb/adjective.

As a class discuss ideas for the word pair.

For example, if the word pair was "Terrifying Chef" the chef could be really dirty and smelly, or only likes to cook insects or it could be a monster!








You're going to write a class mini saga inspired by your word pairing, so decide which of your ideas you like the most.


Now, as you only have 100 words to write your mini saga, it's time to plan to keep the story on track!


Where is the story set?

How could you start the mini saga?

Create an opening sentence(s) together.








Next, discuss what the problem, dilemma or event could be to move the story along.

Remember you are writing a silly story, what could make the story strange or funny?

E.g. The terrifying chef could be a mouse or has cooked a terrible meal, is trying to cook another character or even enter a cooking show!






Then it's time to decide how the story will end – how will you resolve any problems or dilemmas as a class?

Finally, it's time to put all the hard work together and create your class mini saga inspired by the word pairing your teacher has chosen.

Make sure you understand what a mini saga is... if not ask your teacher now!







Your teacher will ask you to come up to the pots with a piece of paper or whiteboard, and pull out one of each card to make a story idea and then write it down.

Hand your cards back to your teacher.

This is the idea that will now inspire your ridiculous writing!









The Floating Toilet

"I can't!" I yelled back. Where was it taking me?








The Clumsy Dinosaur




Reminder of the golden rules of mini saga writing:

 Remember that a mini saga must have a beginning, a middle and an end, and still make sense!






Now you are ready to get writing!
