He painted in many styles

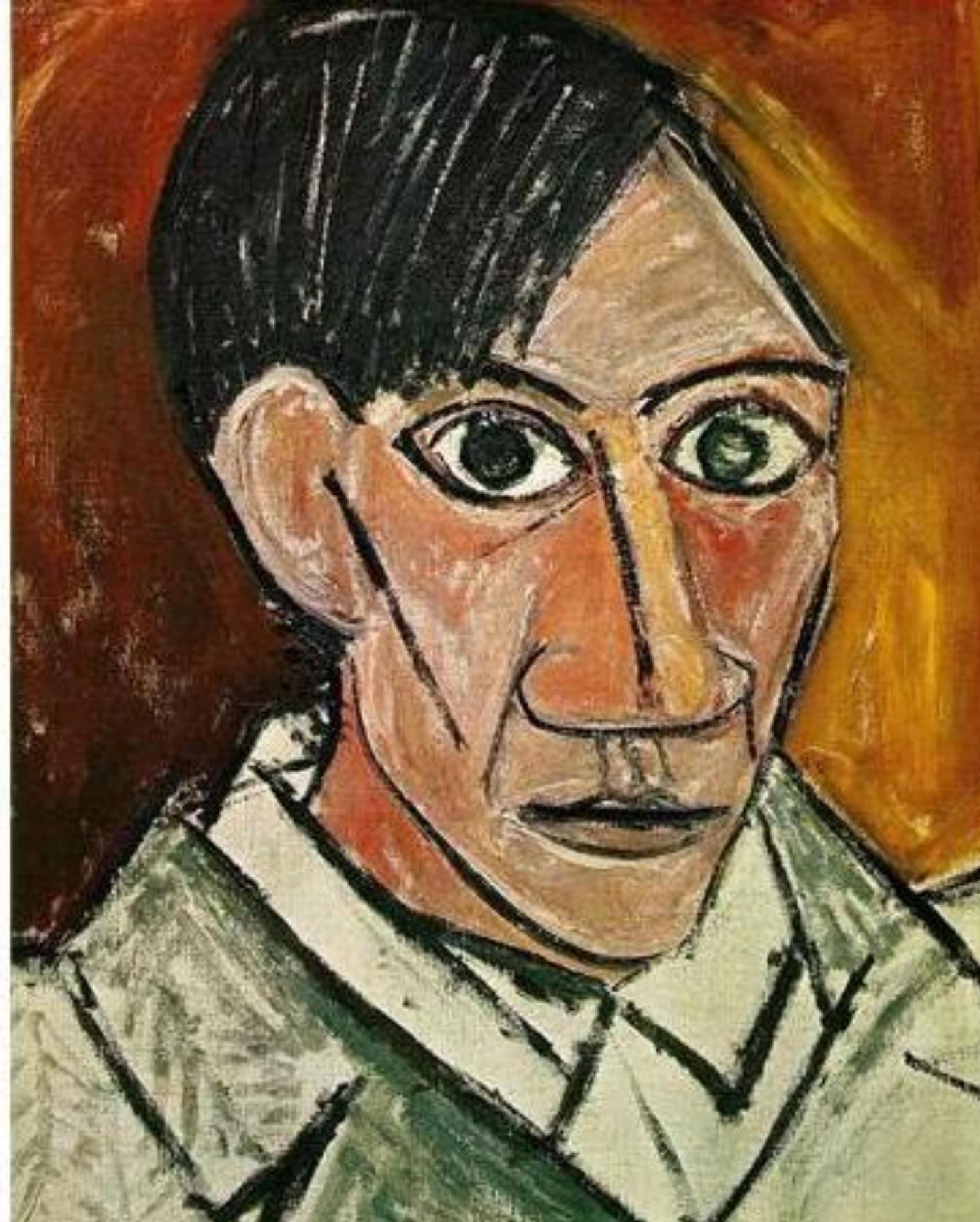
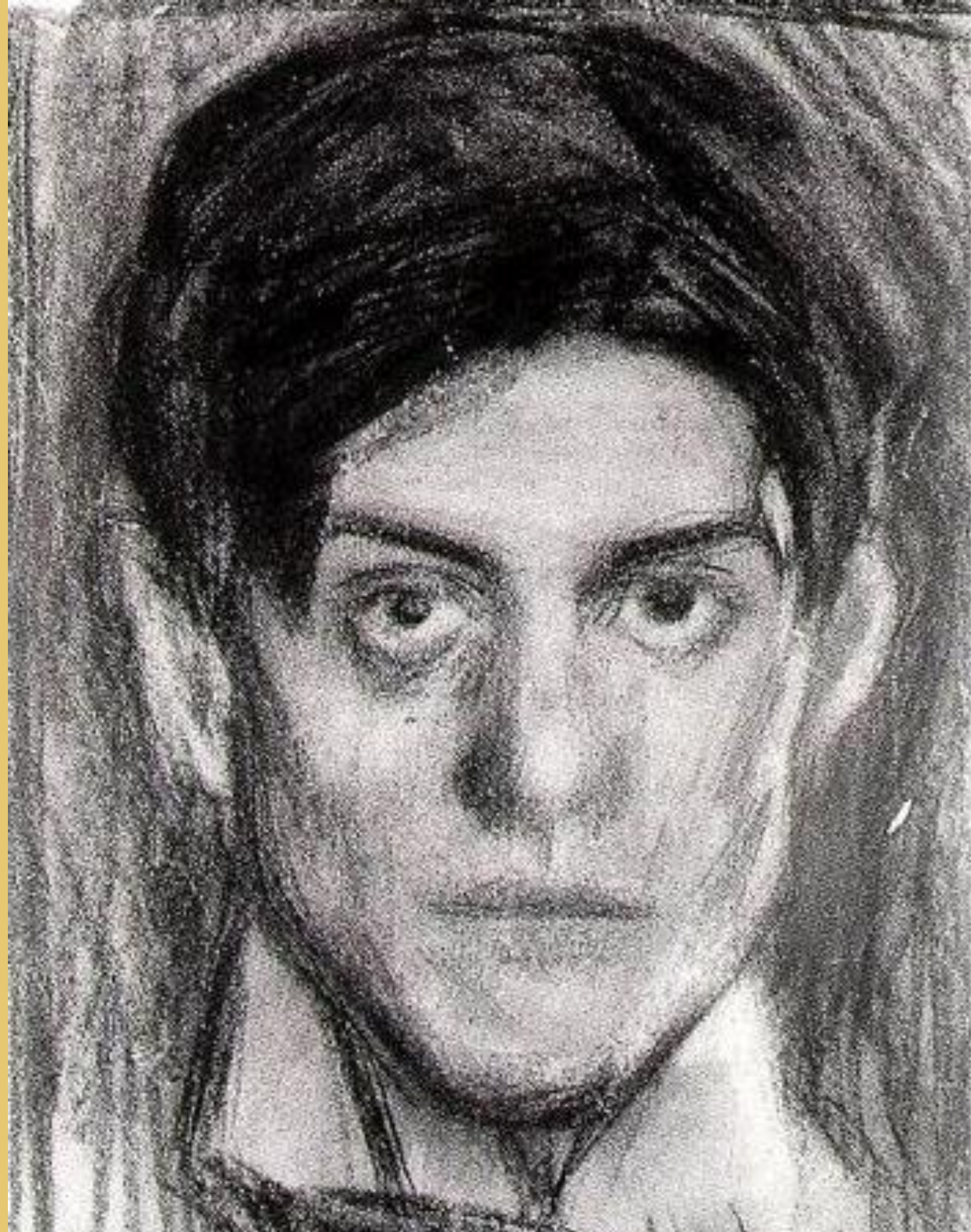
He loved to experiment!

Paintings appear fragmented and abstracted

Lots of geometrical shapes!

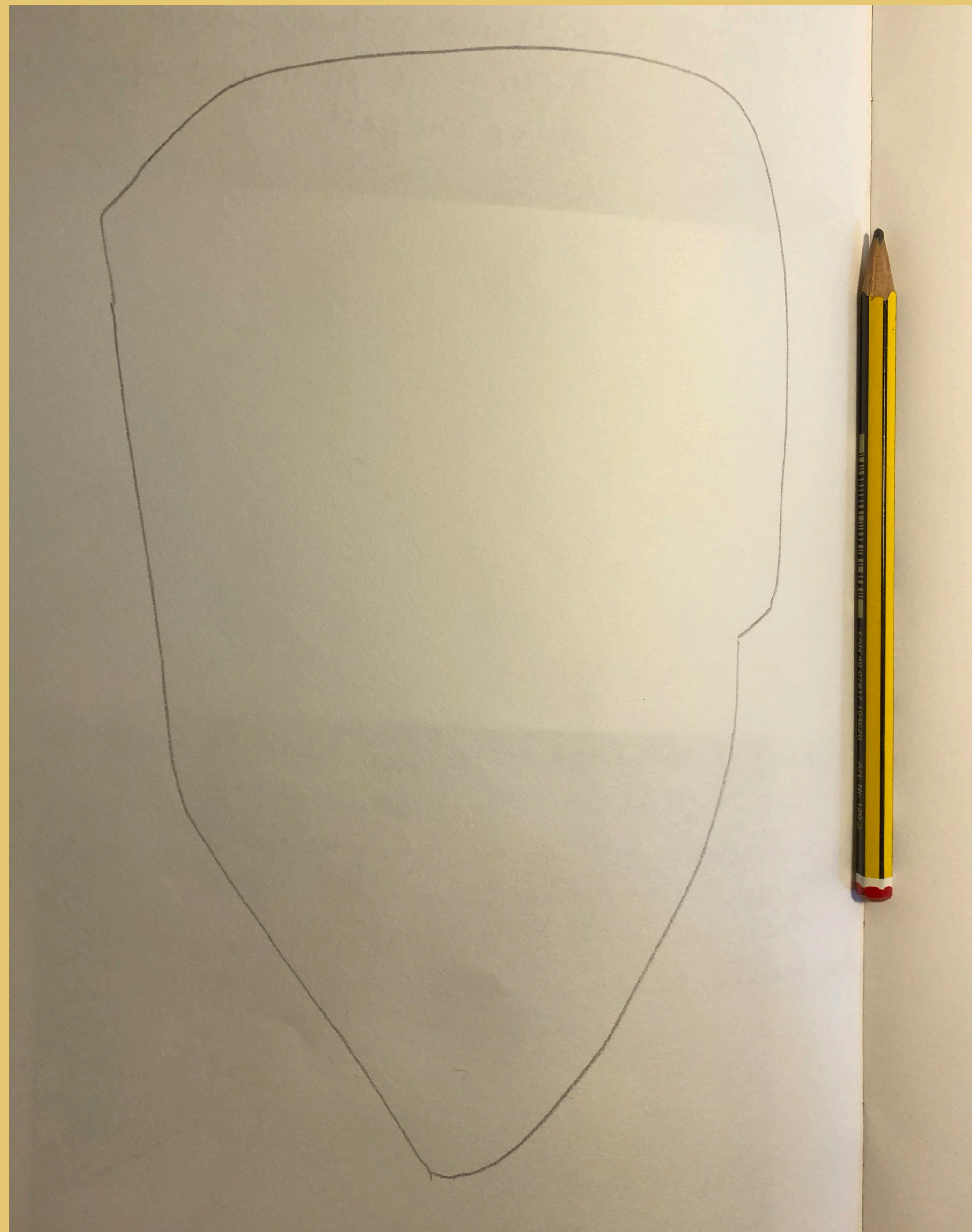

Remember to mix up the view points!



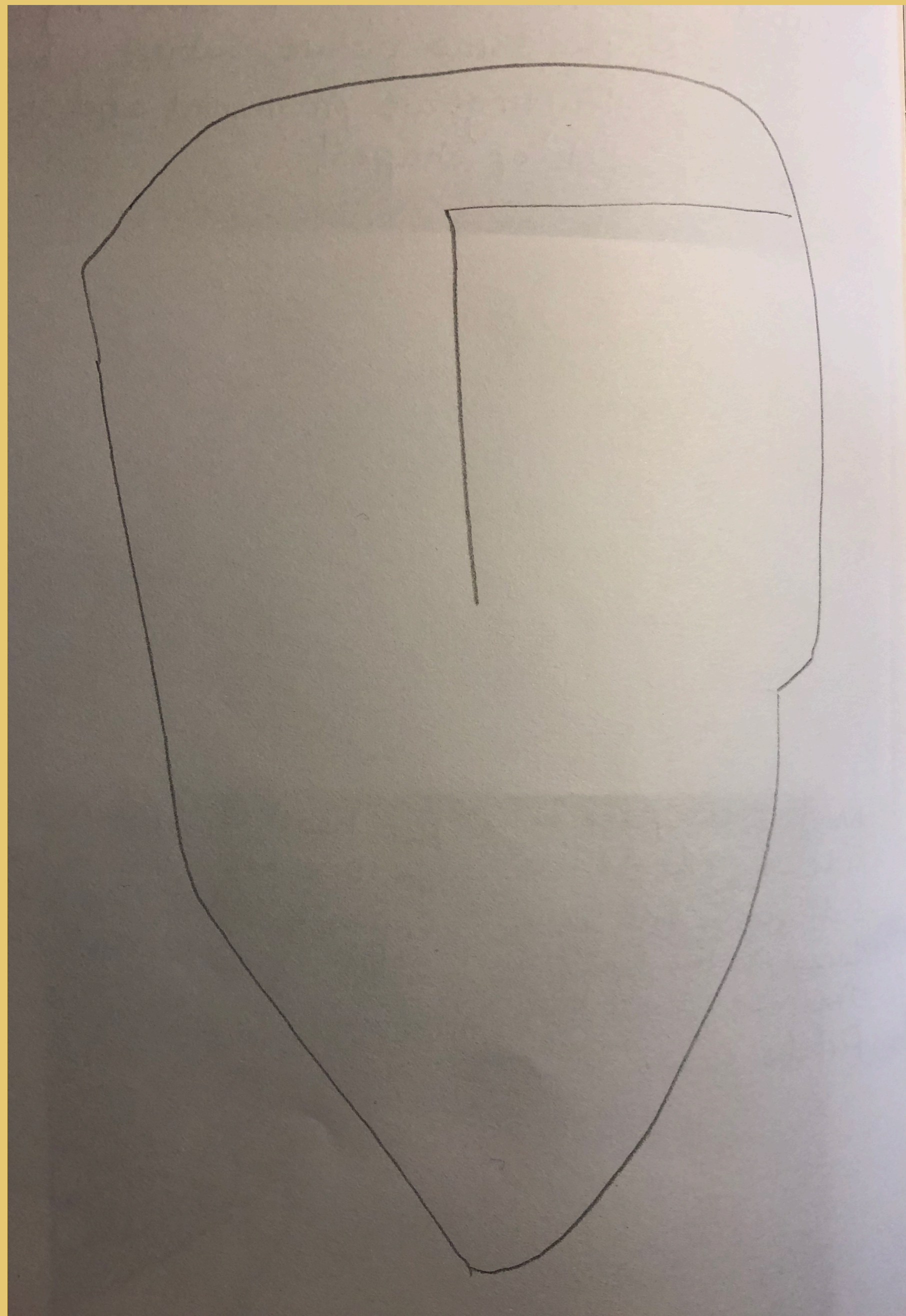
STEP 1

Pick a shape for the head.



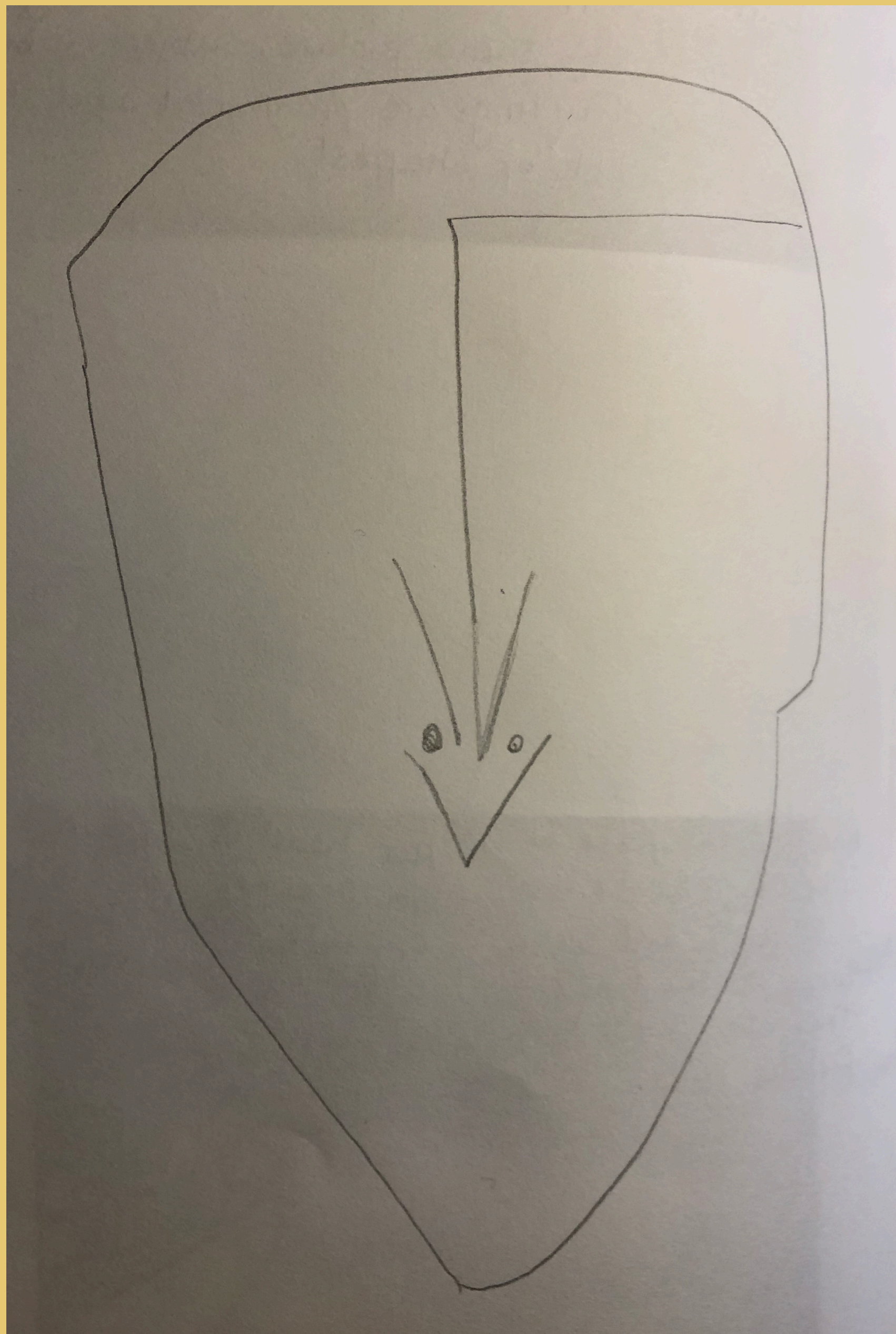
STEP 2

Divide the head, stop before
half way



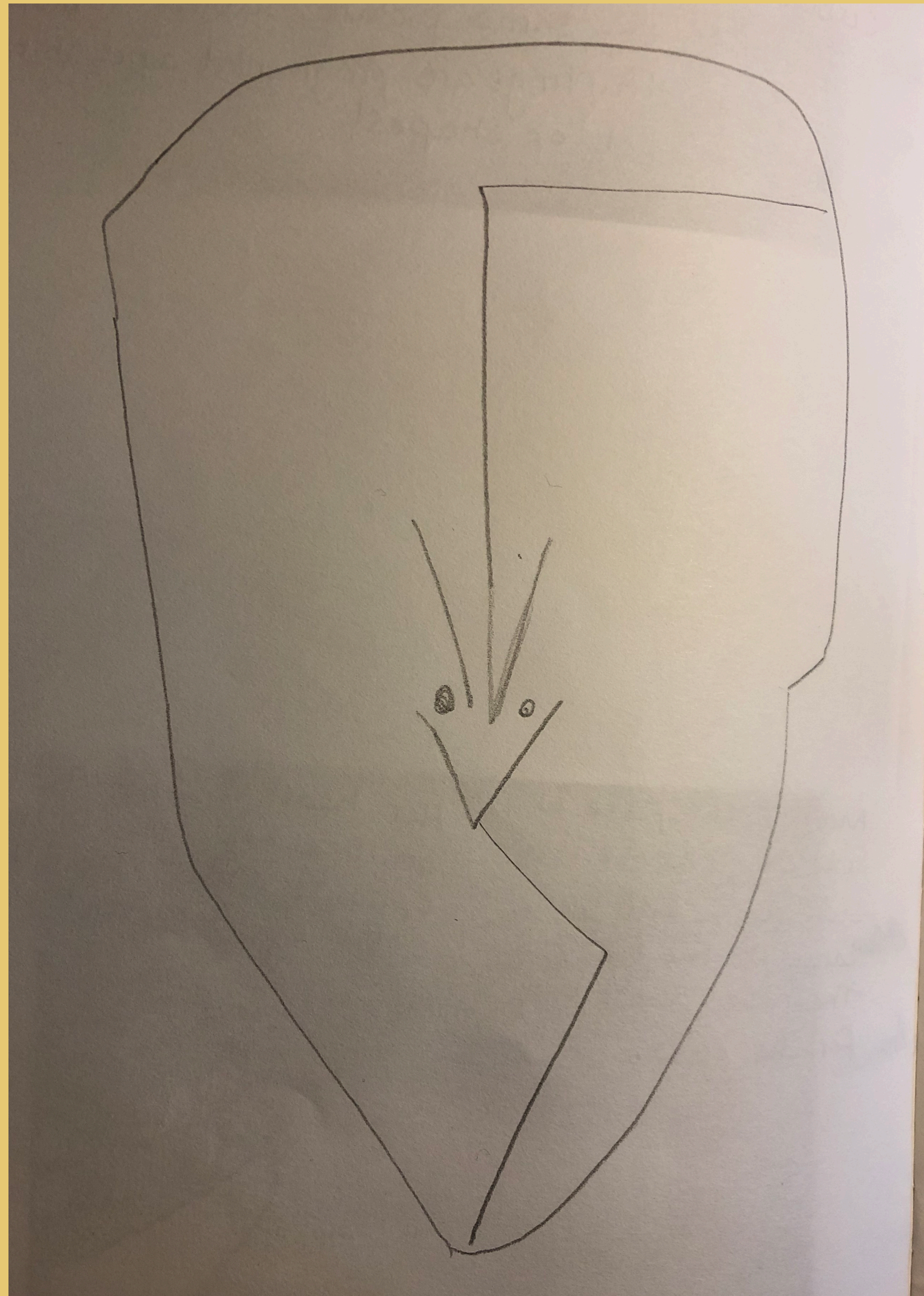
STEP 3

Draw a nose starting from the line you drew to divide the face.



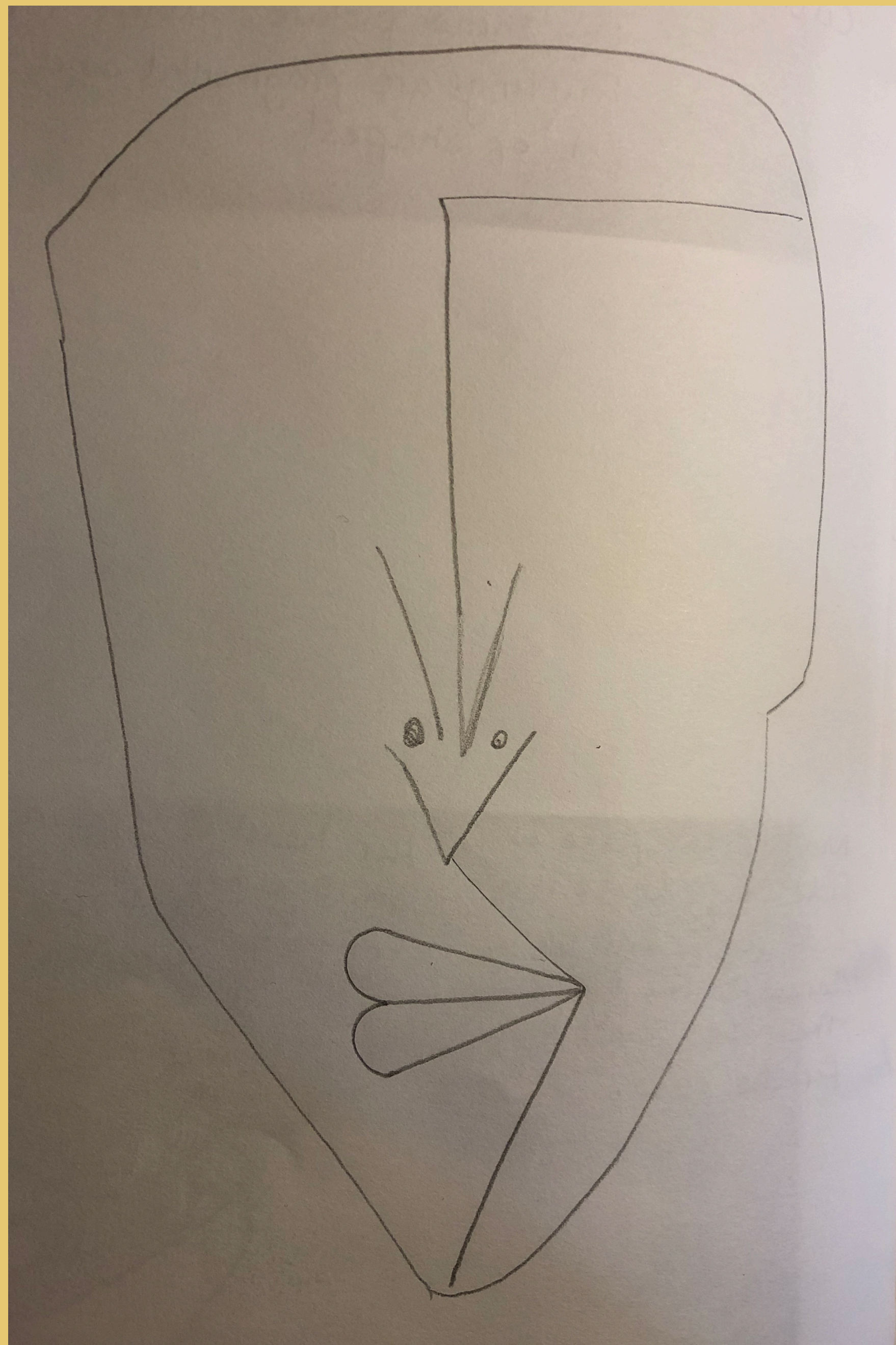
STEP 4

From the nose draw a line to the chin



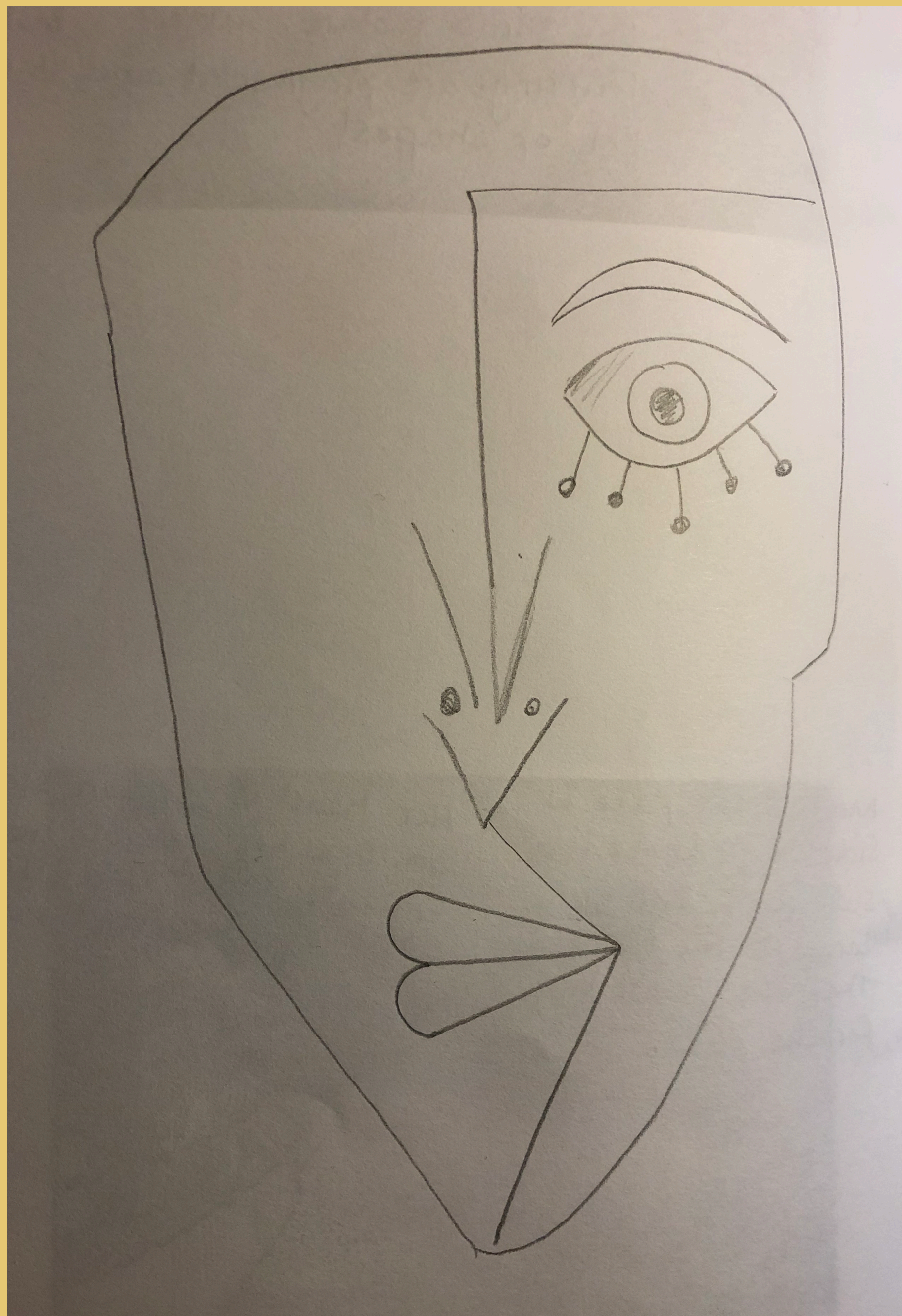
STEP 5

Choose a mouth and draw one half on one side of the line. Then draw the other half



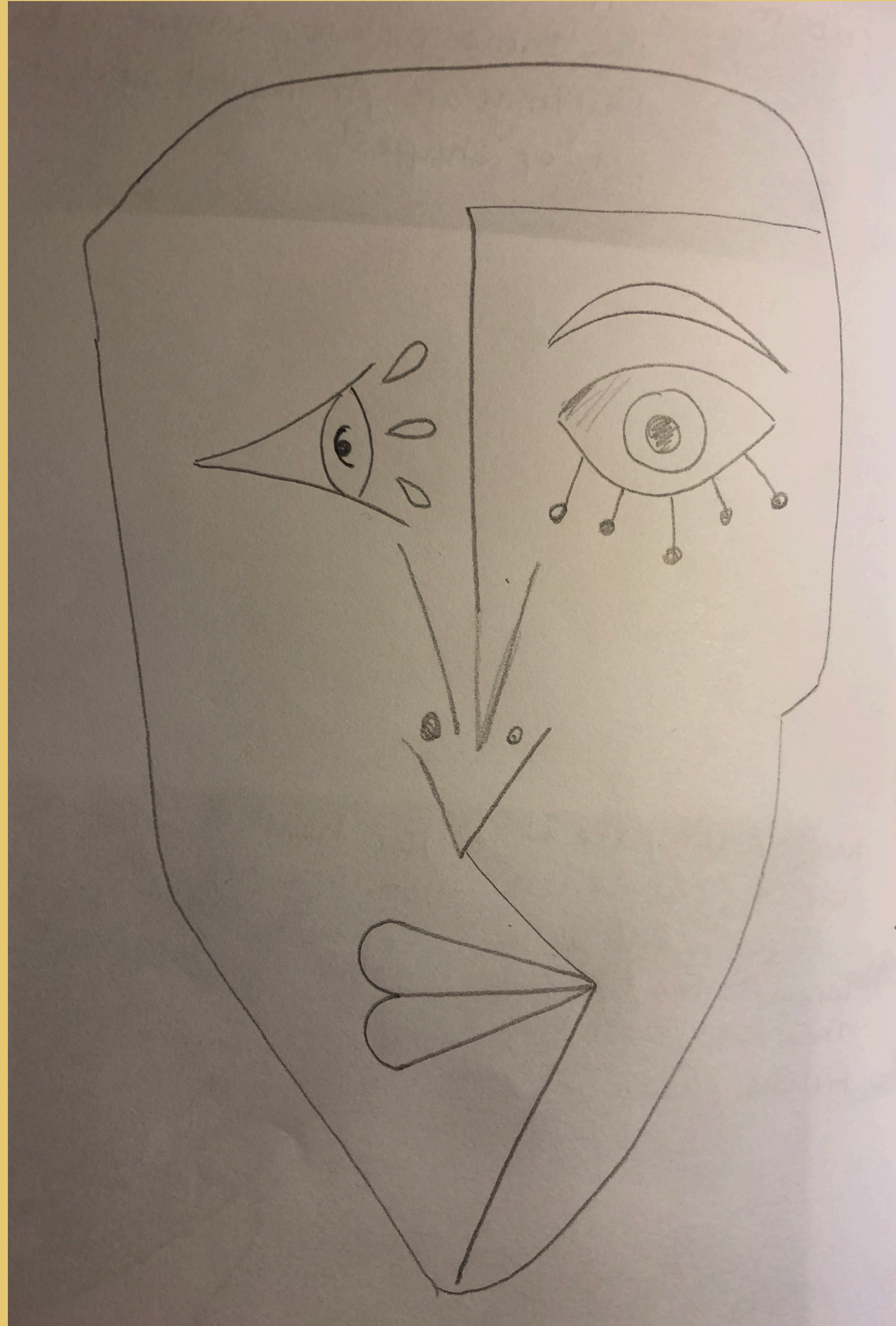
STEP 6

Choose an eye to draw on one side of the face



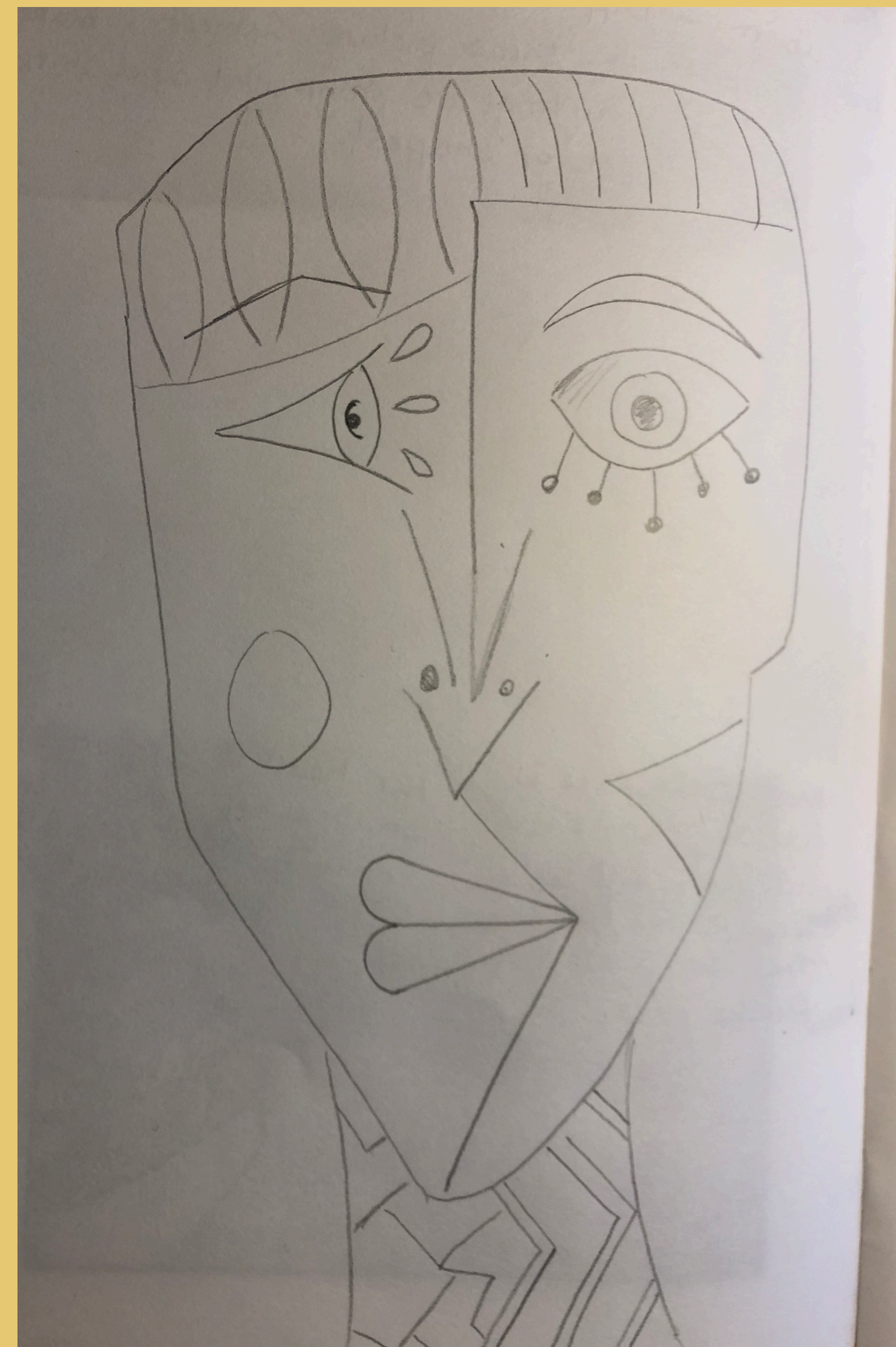
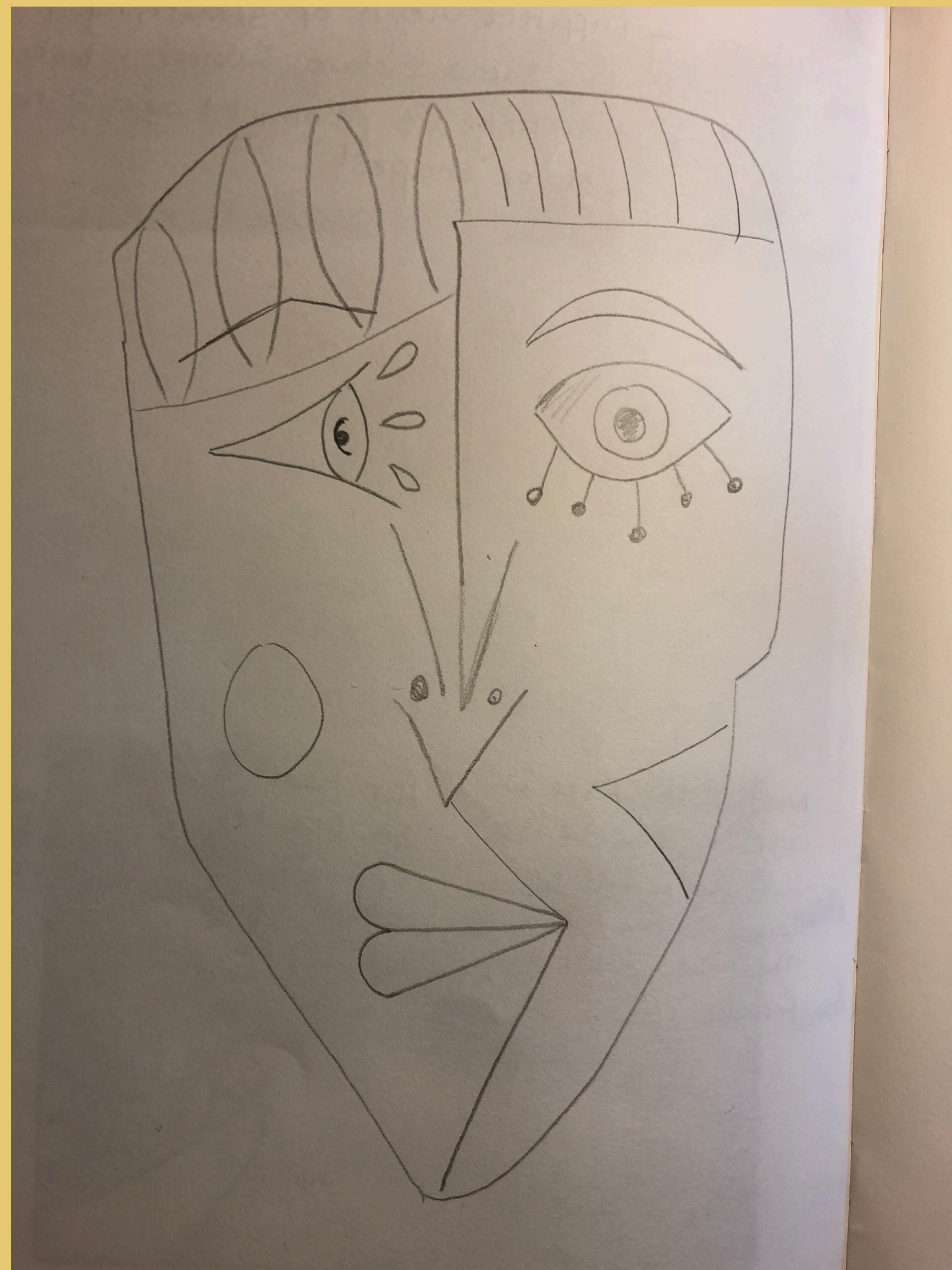
STEP 7

Choose another eye to draw on the other side.
Perhaps choose a different view point?



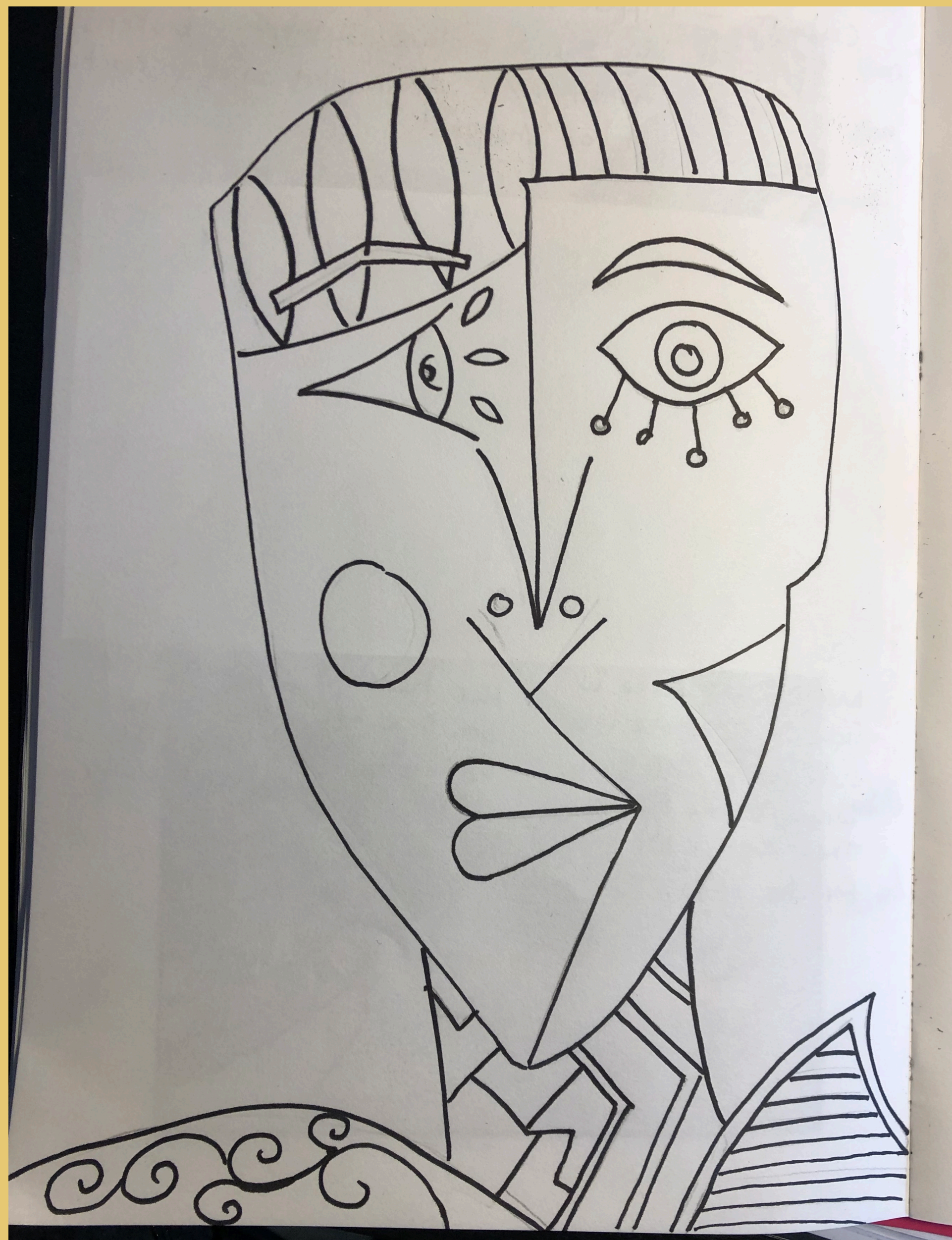
STEP 8

Add a few extra details



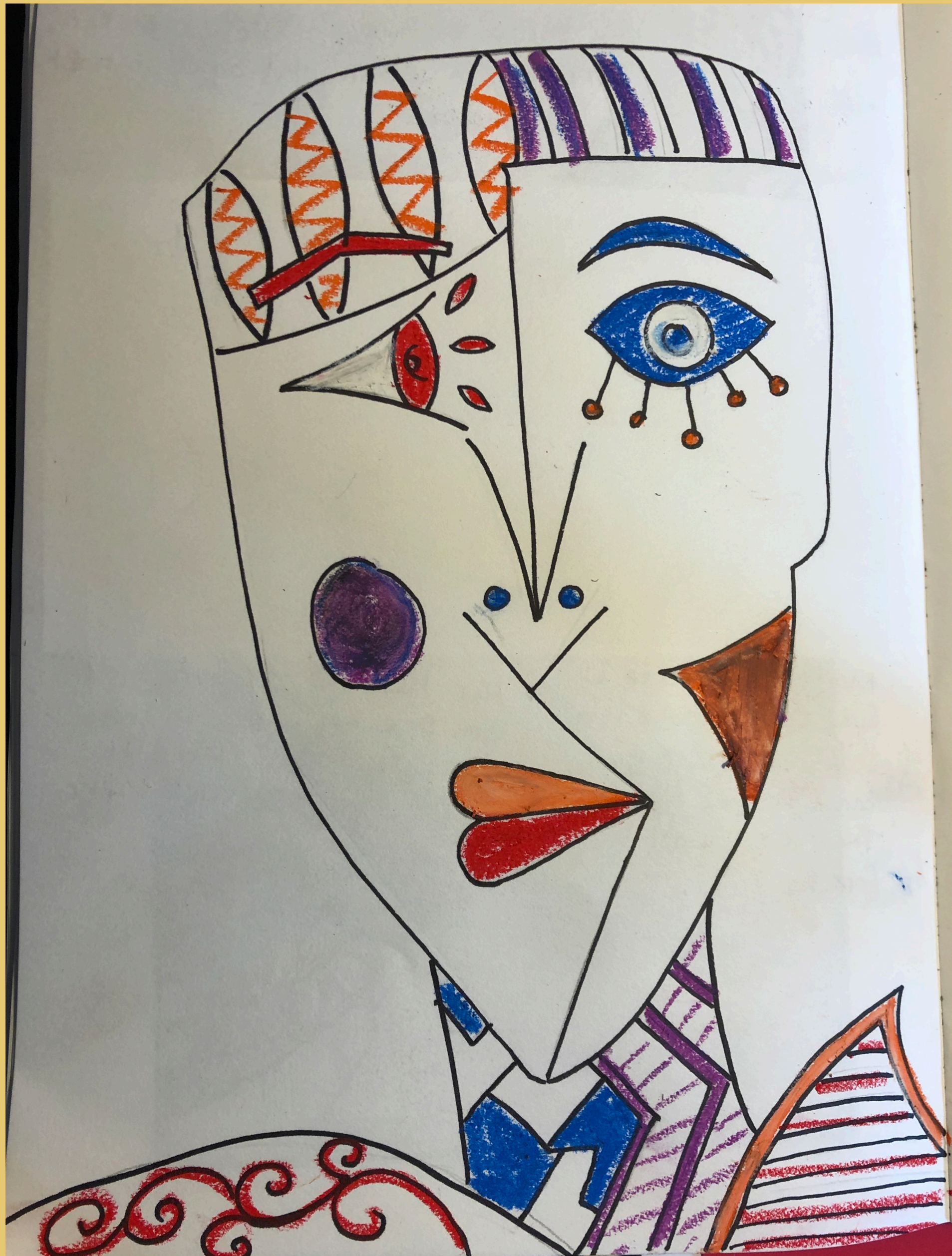
STEP 9

Go over your face in pen!



STEP 10

Use oil pastel to add detail.
Not too much, keep it simple!



STEP 11

Now add watercolours or a watery paint.
If you don't have paint
you can use pencil
crayons
