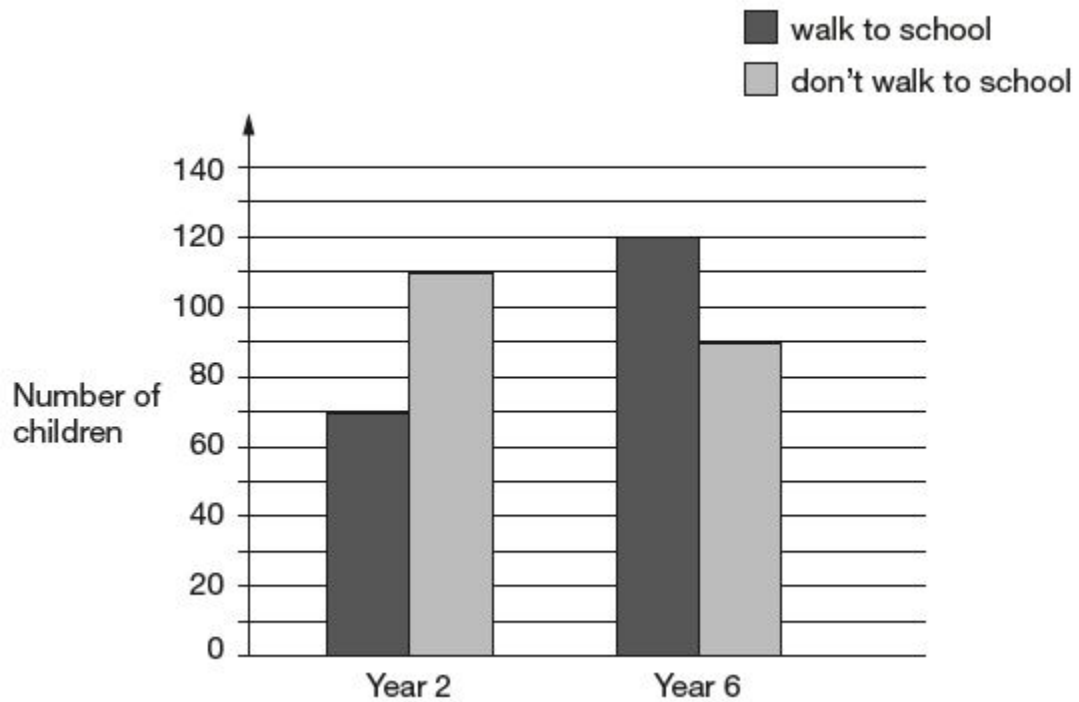

Altogether, how many children **don't** walk to school?

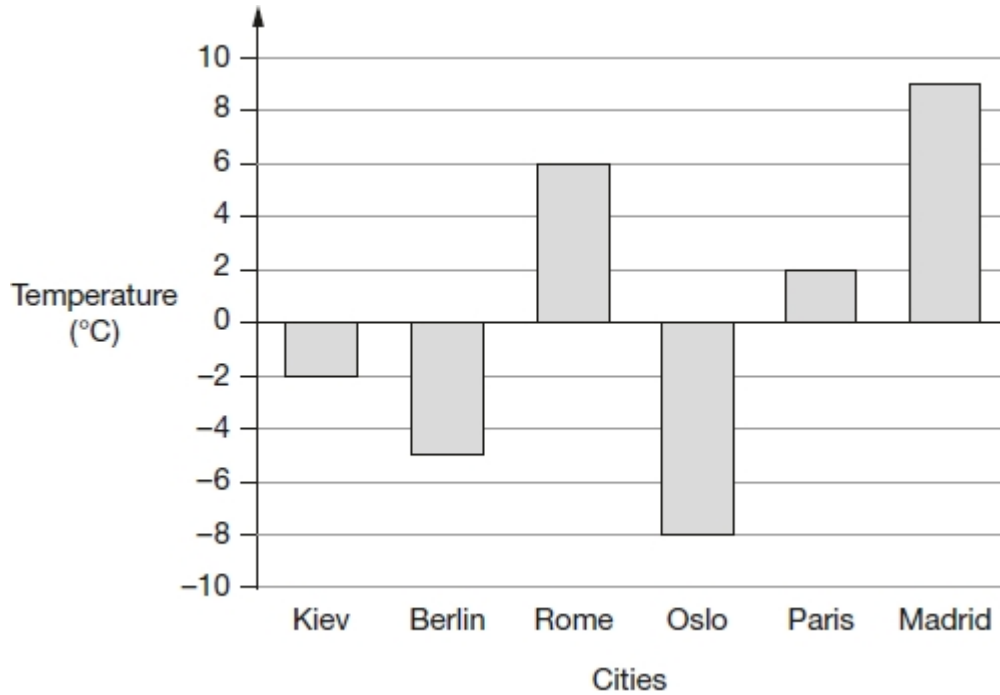

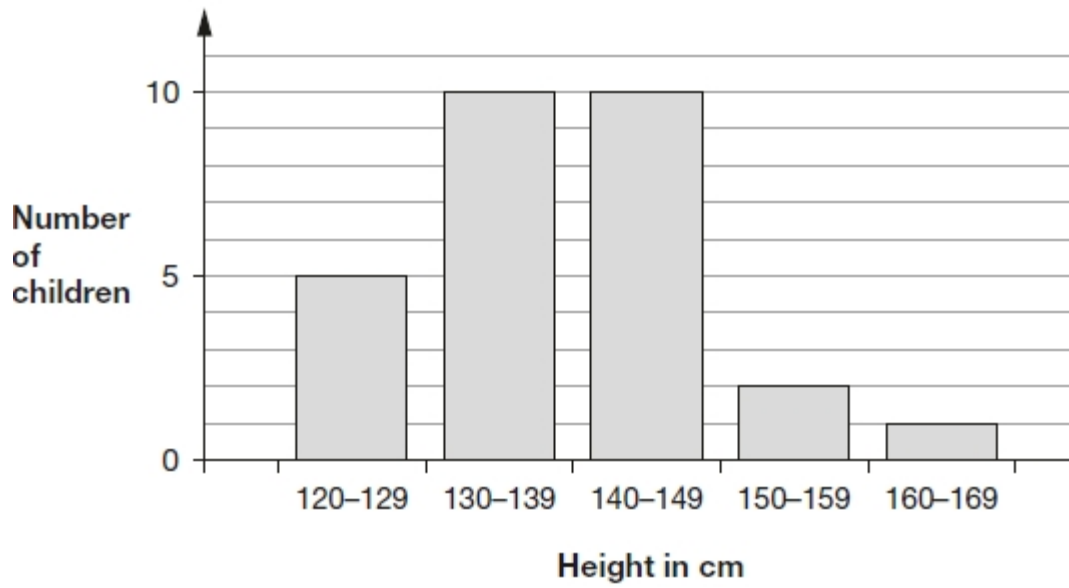

Alfie is 153 cm tall.

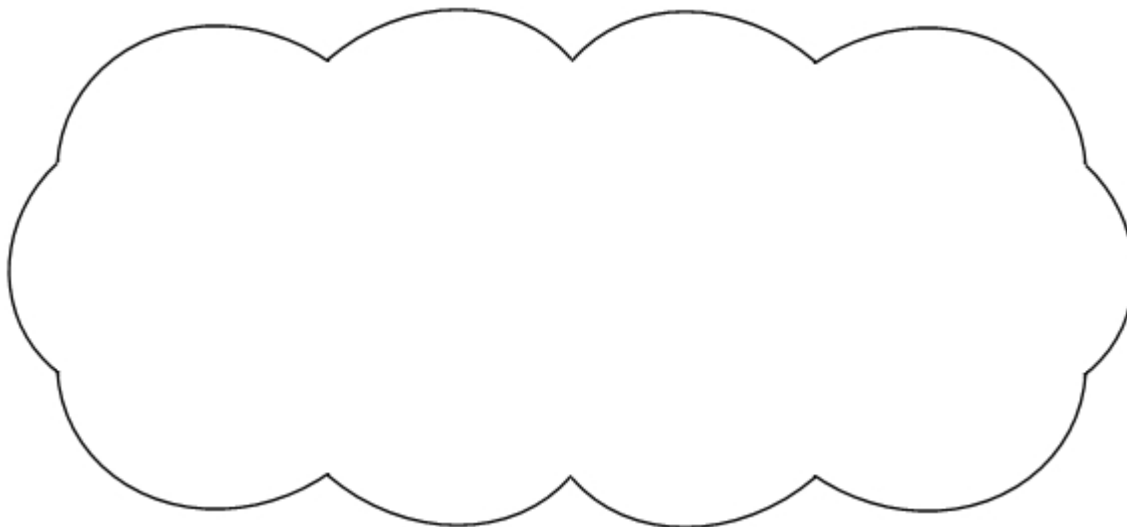

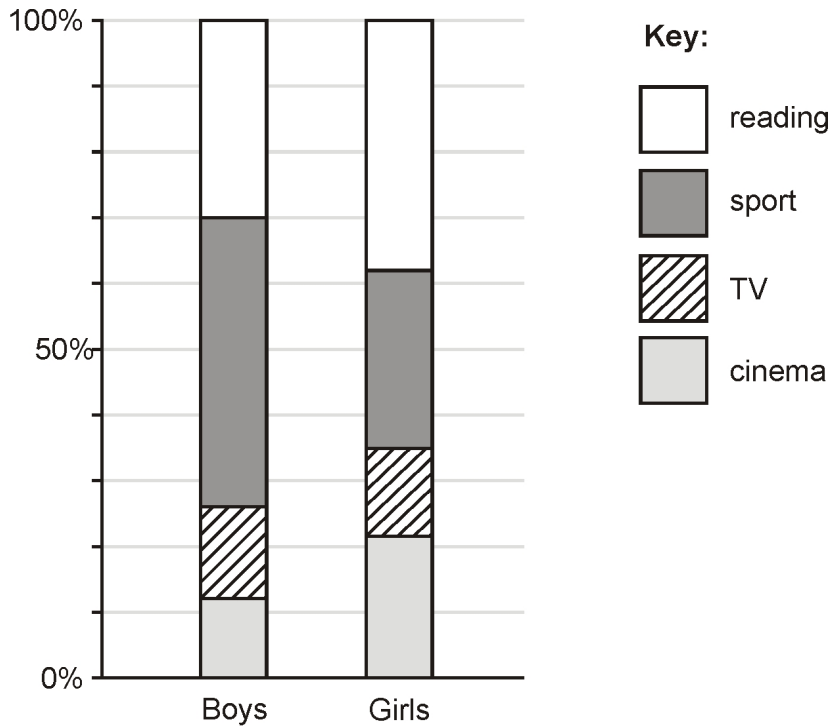

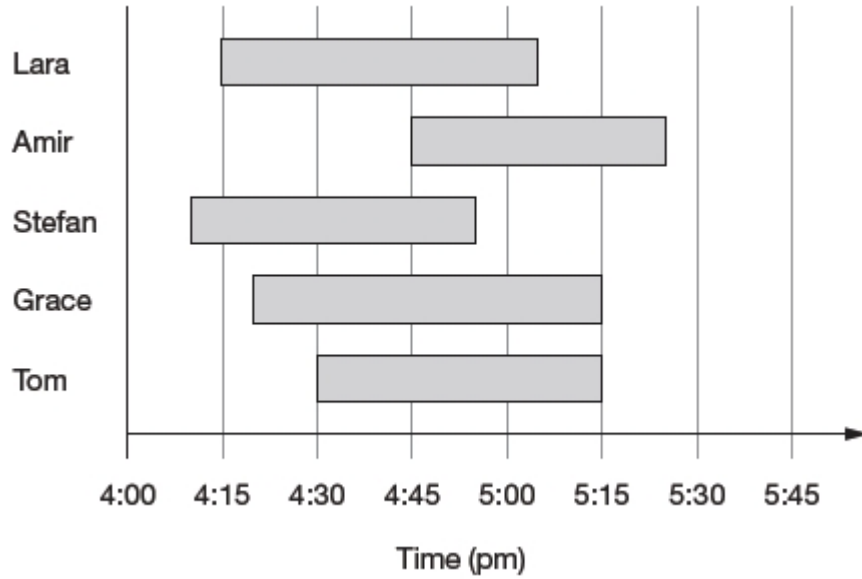
