
The capital city of China is Beijing.

- Families gather together and have a traditional meal of fish and chicken.
- In the north of China people eat dijiaozi a steamed dumpling.
- In the south of China people eat nian gao a sticky, sweet rice pudding.
- People stay up until midnight setting off fireworks to scare away evil spirits.



New Year's Day


- Children wake up to find red envelopes filled with money and sweets under their pillow.

 Each family has their own special dish which they prepare for the banquet.




New Year Celebrations
