### Valentine's Day Traditions around the World

7 Valentine's Day traditions vary from country to country. In Denmark, people give each other pressed 15 white flowers called snowdrops. In South Africa, 22 people write the names of their loved ones on a piece 33 of paper and pin it onto their sleeve. This is where the expression 'to wear your heart on your sleeve' is said 55 to come from. In South Korea, women give chocolate 64 gifts to men on the 14<sup>th</sup> February. They then wait one 75 month until the 14<sup>th</sup> March when men give gifts to 85 women in return. Additionally, in the Philippines, 92 101 people love to get married on Valentine's Day and 109 they hold mass public weddings where hundreds of **116** couples get married at the same time!
