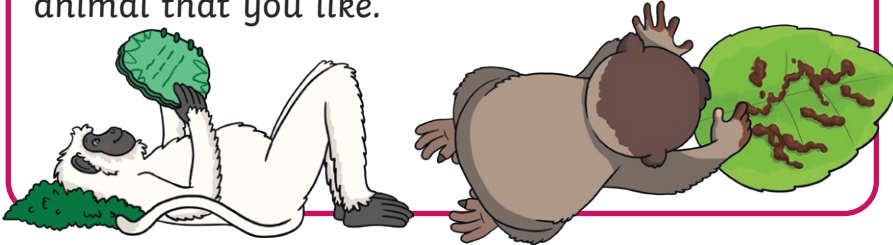


Doris the Loris

Home Learning Challenges

Can you draw a picture of your favourite rainforest animal? You could draw a picture of one of the animals from the story or a different rainforest animal that you like.



In the story, Doris creates a library for her animal friends. She writes stories and non-fiction books for the animals to share. Ask a grown-up if you can visit a library. You might be able to borrow a book to take home. If you can't visit a library, how about making one using some of your favourite books at home? You could share books with your friends and family. Maybe they could borrow a book from you and you could borrow a book from them!

Doris loves writing stories for her animal friends. Can you tell a friend or grown-up a story about your favourite animal? What would happen at the beginning, middle and end of your story? You could write your story onto some folded sheets of paper to make your own book!



Doris works very hard to write lots of books for her library. If she writes 6 books one day and 4 books the next day, how many books has she written altogether? Use your fingers or draw a picture to help you work out the answer.



Doris the loris and her friends live in a rainforest. Ask a grown-up to help you find out information about rainforest animals. You could use books or the Internet. The animals in the story include a loris, pangolin, gibbon, hornbill and cuckoo. What can you find out about these animals? What other animals live in rainforests around the world?



In the story, Doris uses sticks and feathers to write her stories. Go for a walk or look in your garden to find some natural materials you could use to make marks on paper. You could use twigs, leaves or feathers to create lines, patterns and prints.
